



Consultation

Consultation with the sector on Ngā Whanaketanga Rumaki Māori provided an opportunity for all kura and Māori-medium settings to give feedback on the design of Ngā Whanaketanga Rumaki Māori. Feedback was sought on the degree to which:

- the whanaketanga were clearly described and easily understood
- the alignment of the whanaketanga to *Te Marautanga o Aotearoa* is clear
- the whanaketanga are set at the right curriculum levels.

The Ministry of Education consulted on Ngā Whanaketanga Rumaki Māori with:

1. the Māori-medium sector comprising of teachers, principals, boards of trustee members, education sector groups and iwi; and
2. whānau.

Consultation took place between March and June 2010.

The Māori-medium sector had an opportunity to feedback on the draft Ngā Whanaketanga Rumaki Māori by taking part in a series of workshops held throughout Aotearoa New Zealand and/or by completing feedback forms available from schools or by submitting online feedback.
